Hidden Compartments and Vehicle Interdiction

CNOA, HIDTA, MCTFT are jointly hosting 'Hidden Compartments and Vehicle Interdiction-Conducting the Complete Vehicle Stop'.

Hidden Compartments - Drug Traffickers have become very proficient at developing methods to conceal contraband in motor vehicles of all types, creating real detection problems for law enforcement. This new class will provide the student with the latest information on how to locate contraband and hidden compartments. Emphasis will be placed on the systematic approach to vehicle searches, the use of specialized equipment and officer safety. Instructional topics include:

- Define "Search" and the differentiation from a visual inspection.
- Develop a method of searching a vehicle.
- Identify potential compartments in vehicles for drug concealment.

Vehicle interdiction- Conducting the Complete Vehicle Stop – Time permitting the purpose of this topic is to increase law enforcement officer awareness of the possible criminal activity during routine vehicle stops and to train the officers in the proper techniques for a safe, proper and productive vehicle interdiction stop.

Instructors: Mike Corkill, Alaska State Trooper (retired) – Multijurisdictional Counterdrug Task Force Training (MCTFT)

Mike Corkill has over 30 years of law enforcement experience and retired with the rank of First Sergeant as a Deputy Detachment Commander. Corkill has been in narcotics enforcement since 1989 and has served as Statewide Narcotics supervisor and training coordinator. He is a certified drug recognition expert and has instructed for the Drug Enforcement Administration. During his tenure as an Alaska State Trooper, he served as a deputy detachment commander, patrol unit commander, support services commander, search and rescue coordinator, detachment media liaison, academy instructor for drug identification and enforcement and domestic violence, SWAT team, dive master for the Tactical Diving Unit and hostage negotiator. Corkill's holds a Bachelors Degree in Criminal Justice and is a graduate of the FBI National Academy, 169th session.
